Yavapai County – Solid Waste Division

The Solid Waste Division operates under the Public Works Department. In compliance with all federal and state regulations, the Solid Waste Division is responsible for the operation of 8 waste transfer stations, 2 tire yards, trash patrol in the county right of way, adopt-a-road program, community cleanups, free slash, and post-closure county landfills.

There are transfer stations located in Bagdad, Black Canyon City, Camp Verde, Congress, Mayer, Paulden, Seligman, and Skull Valley.

RECYCLABLE

- Aluminum: Aluminum cans, pie plates, frozen dinner pans, foil & food containers
- Metal: Steel food cans, metal lids, EMPTY aerosol cans, wire clothes hangers
- Newspaper, Paper, Junk Mail
- Self-sealing & window envelopes
- Magazines: Glue bound & stapled magazines. No paperback or hardbound books
- Chipboard: Packaging or facial tissue boxes, dry food boxes such as cereal, cake mixes (remove liners), shoe and gift boxes
- Cardboard: Flattened, corrugated and clean
- Plastics: all number 1 through 7 plastics (the number is on the bottom or side of the container). Remove and throw away all lids.

No plastic grocery bags. No Styrofoam.

A recent traffic count on Prescott East Hwy shows a decrease in the traffic since the opening of Jasper Parkway.

Traffic counts were taken on Prescott East Hwy 300 feet North of Antelope Lane. An overall decrease was recorded at 39%.

Yavapai County Library District

The Yavapai County Free Library District (YCFLD)



operates fifteen branch libraries throughout Yavapai County. Established in 1987, the YCFLD is a Special District created by the Yavapai County

Board of Supervisors.

The YCFLD also partially funds individual municipal libraries and funds the operations of the Yavapai Library Network (YLN), a consortium of 55+ public, academic, school, and special libraries in Yavapai County. The YCFLD also facilitates the countywide sharing of library materials among all YLN member libraries.

The Yavapai County Free Library District provides library materials and services to meet the informational, cultural, and recreational needs of all residents of Yavapai County through our branch libraries, our affiliates, and the Yavapai Library Network.

Funds Distributed to the municipalities:

- City of Prescott - \$463,954.61
- Town of Prescott Valley - \$291,461.65
- Sedona Public Library, Inc. - \$203,832.23
- City of Cottonwood - \$120,151.52
- Town of Camp Verde - \$70,235.94
- Town of Chino Valley - \$85,280.79
- Town of Jerome - \$19,955.61

The Library District also funds Sharlot Hall in the amount of \$38,500.00. This helps to offset the cost of their archivist.

Flood Control District

Under State of Arizona enabling legislation, flood control districts are political subdivisions, designated as

special taxing districts, and are given the authority to levy a secondary property tax on parcels within the County.

The tax rates are set by the Yavapai

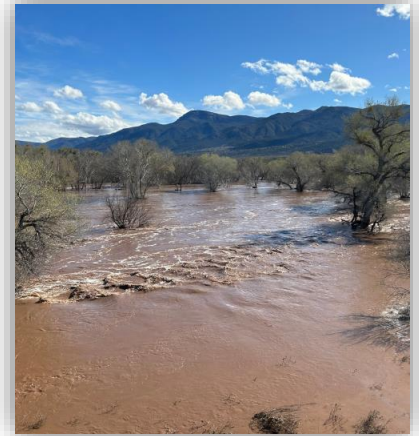
County Flood Control Board of Directors. Flood Control District projects are funded by a variety of Federal, State, District, County and City cost sharing partnerships.

The Flood Control District also implements the following Federal Emergency Management Agency Programs:

The Flood Control District is responsible for floodplain management in all unincorporated areas of Yavapai County as well as regulates FEMA floodplains in incorporated communities of Camp Verde, Clarkdale, Dewey-Humboldt, Jerome, and Wickenburg.

The Flood Control District does not regulate within the city boundaries of Prescott, Prescott Valley, Sedona, Chino Valley, and Cottonwood.



The list below shows how much money went unspent last year and has been rolled over, the "25/26 Levy" is money from this year's levy that is set aside, and the total. *Please note Chino Valley has specifically asked to roll their money over until they have enough to pay for a large drainage project.
