

DOG LICENSE, POUND & OBSERVATION FEES
Jan. 21, 1963 Minutes excerpt

and State Funds may be appropriated for the improvement and paving of the road. This Resolution made as a result of the petition received containing 262 signatures from Northern Arizona residents.

A petition was received from 42 residents of the Mayer area requesting the establishment of a Volunteer Fire Department in the Mayer area. On motion of Supervisor Estes, seconded by Supervisor Rohrer, and continuously carried, the petition was accepted and referred to the Clerk of the Board for verification and an Order and Call of Election to be entered at such time as verification is complete.

Dr. Warner appeared before the Board and discussed the matter of Rabies Control and after due consideration there was a motion by Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes and unanimously carried, adopting Resolution No. 37 concerning Pound and Observation fees and also Dog License fees for the coming year.

There was a motion of Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes, and unanimously carried, approving the request of the Board of Trustees of Prescott School District No. 1 to exceed its 1962-1963 budget in the amount of \$530.00 for the improvement of Adjacent Public Ways.

The Board together with George M. Ireland, County Attorney, counted the money in the office of the County Treasurer for the quarter ending December 31, 1962, and the same was found to be correct and correspond with the balance shown on the books as follows:

There was a motion by Supervisor Estes, seconded by Supervisor Rohrer, and unanimously carried

in the absence of any objections, a Person to Person transfer of a #8 and #9 Liquor License from Don E. Carlson to U. K. Fuller, Cornville, be approved.

There was a motion by Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes, and unanimously carried, that Mrs. Virginia M. Brown be reappointed to the Yavapai County Welfare/Board for a five year term beginning January 31, 1963.

On motion of Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the recommendation of the County Assessor, Joel H. Baldwin, to strike from the 1962 Real Property Roll, #39, #12728, #14755, and #18019. There was a motion by Supervisor Estes, seconded by Supervisor Rohrer, and unanimously carried, to strike from the 1962 Real Property Roll, assessment No. 17700 in the amount of \$980.00.

There was a motion by Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes, and unanimously carried, authorizing Humboldt, School District No. 22, to transfer \$44.02, the balance in the fund, from Building Fund No. 2 to the General Fund of the District.

There was a motion by Supervisor Estes, seconded by Supervisor Rohrer, and unanimously carried, approving the requests of the Boards of Trustees of Kirkland School District No. 23 to exceed its 1962-1963 budget in the amount of \$1,200.00; Mayer School District No. 43 to exceed its 1962-1963 budget in the amount of \$3,005.33 and Union School District No. 50 to exceed its 1962-1963 budget in the amount of \$4,000.00, all due to increased attendance.

A motion was made by Supervisor Rohrer, seconded by Supervisor Estes, and unanimously carried, to approve Special Fund Voucher #36, School District No. 6, Service Systems, Elementary, in the amount of \$476.08.

There was a motion by Supervisor Estes, seconded by Supervisor Rohrer, and unanimously carried, approving the action of Sheriff G. A. Ayars in the appointment of James C. Pritchett and Worthington F. Karn as Sheriff's Deputies; and the action of Frank C. Bauer, County Recorder in appointing the following as Deputies for Voter Registration; Burr Marley, Paul M. Webb, Pauline H. Boyer, A. J. Moser, Pearl G. Steinhaus, Harley O. Mount, Blanche Riley, Martha L. McMillin, N.S. Oberan, Mary Ellen Jones, Robert C. Shankland, J. Emil Muller, Jessie J. Elmer, Alma K. Amann, Annie L. Osborne, Matt I. Leikas, H. W. Cole and Velma S. Cooper.
