This being the day and hour set for the sale of a small parcel of County property at public auction, the Clerk called for bids. To be sold was 0.9846 acres located near the Yavapai County Youth Center. The Prescott Medical Foundation bid \$100.00 and there being no further bids, there was a motion by Supervisor Pruitt, seconded by Supervisor Owens, and unanimously carried, to accept the bid and take it under advisement.

The following group appeared before the Board concerning further and future improvements on the Prescott-Simmons Highway: Ray Codwen, C. Delbert Pierce, Jack Morgan, R. J. Fuller, Greene Cattle Co., Gene Smith, G. H. Beck, Yola Ranch, Jack Turney, Spider Ranch, John Matli, Robert H. Kieckhefer, Charley Matli and Dorothy Safely. After discussion concerning the possibility, Chairman Rohrer stated on behalf of the Board, that the improvements on the road would be continued if the State Highway Department would accept November payment for the project.

There was a motion by Supervisor Owens, seconded by Supervisor Pruitt, and unanimously carried, to accept and approve the Monte Vista Subdivision, a part of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 3, T8N, R2E, G&SRB&M, Yavapai County, Arizona, as presented by Phoenix Title and Trust Company.

There was discussion concerning the Neighborhood Youth Corps summer program with Alvin Allen, the County Agricultural Extension Agent, and the Chairman directed the Clerk to call a meeting of the Superintendents of the High Schools in the County and other interested parties on Thursday, April 22nd, at 1:30 P. M. to determine whether or not the program would be initiated in Yavapai County.

There was a motion by Supervisor Pruitt, seconded by Supervisor Owens, and unanimously carried, adopting a resolution to abandon a part of old U. S. Highway 89 which had reverted to the County by virtue of a State Highway abandonment and is located in a part of the W $\frac{1}{2}$, Sec. 13, T14N, R2W, G&SRB&M, Yavapai County, Arizona. This abandonment was requested by Mr. Herman Schullenback and Fred M. Storey, the abutting land owners, and it was further resolved that the title to the property abandoned be vested in the abutting land owners.

There was a motion by Supervisor Owens, seconded by Supervisor Pruitt, and unanimously carried, approving an Original No. 6 Liquor License application in the name of the Yavapai Hotels Corporation to be located at Diamond Valley.
