

YAVAPAI JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT SPECIAL BOND ELECTION
April 17, 1967

The Prescott City Council unanimously moved to accept as a City street, the Thumb Butte Road, a County dedicated road, from Elwood Lane, inside the City Limits, to the Prescott City Limits. The Board of Supervisors directed the County Attorney to prepare a deed of the property to the City of Prescott.

The reports of the various departments were read, approved and ordered filed.

The Chairman reported approval of the following Notary Bonds: Earl Haefner Jr., T. Nichtern, Hollie C. Sugg and Florence B. Unruh.

There was a motion by Supervisor Pruitt, seconded by Supervisor Owens, and unanimously carried, approving the recommendation of the County Assessor, Joel H. Baldwin, to make the following strike in the 1966 Personal Property Roll: #1603.

There was a motion by Supervisor Owens, seconded Pruitt, and unanimously carried, approving appointment by Frank C. Bauer, the County Recorder, of Ruby E. Smith as Deputy Recorder without compensation.

Appearing before the Board was Richard Walraven, President of the Board of Trustees of the Yavapai County Junior College District, requesting that a special bond election be called for the Junior College District. There was a motion by Supervisor Pruitt, seconded by Supervisor Owens, and unanimously carried, to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION ORDERING AND PROVIDING NOTICE OF SPECIAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MAY 23, 1967, IN AND FOR YAVAPAI COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT, OF YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE REAL PROPERTY TAXPAYERS OF THE DISTRICT, WHO ARE ALSO IN ALL RESPECTS QUALIFIED ELECTORS THEREOF, THE QUESTION OF ISSUING AND SELLING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE DISTRICT IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$2,500,000 TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO AID IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A COMPLETE JUNIOR COLLEGE INCLUDING DORMITORIES, TO BE BUILT ON LAND TO BE PURCHASED FOR SUCH PURPOSE, THE COST OF SUCH LAND NOT TO EXCEED \$100,000, AND TO FURNISH AND EQUIP SUCH JUNIOR COLLEGE AND TO IMPROVE THE GROUNDS THEREOF, IN YAVAPAI COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT OF YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of Yavapai County Junior College District, of Yavapai County, Arizona, has adopted a resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona to order and call, pursuant to the provisions of Title 35, Chapter 3, Article 3, Arizona Revised Statutes, and subject to all limitations imposed by Article 9, Section 8 of the Constitution of the State of Arizona, a special bond election to be held in and for the District, on Tuesday, May 23, 1967, to submit to the real property taxpayers of the District, who are also in all respects qualified electors thereof, the question of issuing and selling negotiable, serial, coupon, general obligation bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$2,500,000 to provide funds to aid in the construction of a complete Junior College including dormitories, to be built on land to be purchased for such purpose, the cost of such land not to exceed \$100,000, and to furnish and equip such Junior College and to improve the grounds thereof, in Yavapai County Junior College District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA:

Section 1. That a special bond election in and for Yavapai County Junior College District, of Yavapai County, Arizona, be and the same is hereby ordered and called to be held on Tuesday, May 23, 1967, which day is not less than thirty nor more than sixty days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, at which time there shall be submitted to the real property taxpayers of the District, who are also in all respects qualified electors thereof, the question of issuing and selling negotiable, serial, coupon, general obligation bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$2,500,000, the bonds and the purpose for which the proceeds from the sale thereof are to be used are more fully described in the question hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. That the bond election shall be called and notice thereof given by posting a copy of the order and call of special bond election in at least five (5) public places in the District and a copy at the polling places hereinafter set forth, in Yavapai County Junior College District, Yavapai County, Arizona, not less than twelve (12) days prior to the date of such election, and by publishing such order and call of special bond election once a week for not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election in the Yavapai County Messenger, a weekly newspaper, published and of general circulation in Yavapai County, designated for such purpose, and that the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause such order and call of special

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bond election to be posted and published according to law and to the provisions of this resolution.

Section 3. That the order and call of special bond election shall be given, posted and published as hereinabove provided and shall be in substantially the following form:

ORDER AND CALL OF SPECIAL BOND ELECTION

TO THE REAL PROPERTY TAXPAYERS OF YAVAPAI COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT, OF YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA, WHO ARE ALSO IN ALL RESPECTS QUALIFIED ELECTORS THEREOF.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special bond election has been ordered and called by the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona, pursuant to the provisions of Title 35, Chapter 3, Article 3, Arizona Revised Statutes, and subject to all limitations imposed by Article 9, Section 8 of the Constitution of the State of Arizona, and will be held on Tuesday, May 23, 1967, at the following named polling places:

in Yavapai County Junior College District, of Yavapai County, Arizona, for the purpose of submitting to the vote of the real property taxpayers of the district, who are also in all respects qualified electors thereof, the following question:

QUESTION

Shall the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona, be authorized to issue and sell negotiable, serial, coupon, general obligation bonds of Yavapai County Junior College District, Yavapai County, Arizona, in the principal amount of \$2,500,000, thereby increasing the indebtedness of the District not above 10% of the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the District, to provide funds to aid in the construction of a complete Junior College including dormitories, to be built on land to be purchased for such purpose, the cost of such land not to exceed \$100,000, and to furnish and equip such Junior College and to improve the grounds thereof, in Yavapai County Junior College District, Yavapai County, Arizona, bonds to be issued in one or more series, to be dated the date of their issuance, to be in the denomination of \$1,000 or multiples thereof, to bear interest from date of issuance to the maturity of each bond of a series at a rate of not to exceed 5% per annum, payable semi-annually during the term of each bond of a series, bonds to mature annually in amounts to be determined by the Board of Supervisors within a period of not to exceed twenty years from the date of each series of bonds?

That the above named polling places will be open at the hour of 6:00 o'clock A. M. and will be closed at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P. M. on election day.

No ballots will be received by the judges of the election unless the person offering such ballot is a taxpayer for real property in the district and is also in all respects a qualified elector thereof.

Section 5. That the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to have printed and delivered to the election officers in each of the polling places to be by them furnished to the qualified real property

taxpaying electors of Yavapai County Junior College District, of Yavapai County, Arizona, offering to vote at the special bond election, ballots which shall contain the foregoing question, followed by the words "Bonds, and "Bonds, No", and the electors shall indicate their approval or disapproval of the question submitted by placing a cross in the square opposite the words on their ballots which express their choice.

Section 6. That the special bond election shall be held, conducted and canvassed in conformity with the provisions of the general election laws of the State of Arizona, except as otherwise provided by law, and only such persons shall be permitted to vote at the special bond election, who are real property taxpayers of Yavapai County Junior College District, of Yavapai County, Arizona, and who are also in all respects qualified electors thereof.

Section 7. That the returns from said special bond election shall be made to the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona, within twelve (12) days from the date of the election and shall be canvassed and the results thereof certified by the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona, at a meeting to be held on Monday, June 5, 1967, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P. M., being the first Monday, following on the twelfth day after the day of election, as provided by law.

The Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County, Arizona, met in special session, Monday, April 24, 1967, at 10:00 o'clock A. M.

The terms of an employment agreement between Yavapai County and Ed Malm and Robert Jackson in regards to the operation of the Oak Creek Airport were discussed with Mr. Malm and Mr. Jackson of Sedona.

There was a motion by Supervisor Pruitt, seconded by Supervisor Owens, and unanimously carried, that the Board concurs with the City of Prescott that all costs of the acquisition of right-of-way required from the two parcels, viz: Whitaker and Karcic, will be divided equally between the City and the County, on Willow Creek Road in connection with the right-of-way realignment as proposed.
