

RESOLUTION NO. 136

WHEREAS, Joe Sarvis, County Engineer, has this 23rd day of September, 1968, presented his report concerning the acquisition of a right-of-way to property to be used as a County dump located in Chino Valley, said right-of-way to be more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northwest corner of E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 35, Township 16 North, Range 2 West, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Yavapai County, Arizona, and the true point of beginning of this description; thence easterly for 15 feet along the north line of said Section 35; thence southerly and parallel to the mid-section line of said Section 35 for 409.57 feet; thence easterly and parallel to the north line of said Section 35 for approximately 2671 feet; thence northerly and parallel to the east line of said Section 35 for 397.07 feet; thence east and parallel with the north line of said Section 35 for 15.0 feet to a point on the east line of said Section 35.

This description describes a road centerline and the width of the roadway is 30 feet; 15 feet on each side of the above described centerline.

The acreage involved is ^{2.42}~~2.58~~ acres.

WHEREAS, because of the premises, the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County finds the public necessity, convenience and safety requires the acquisition of said right-of-way for road purposes;

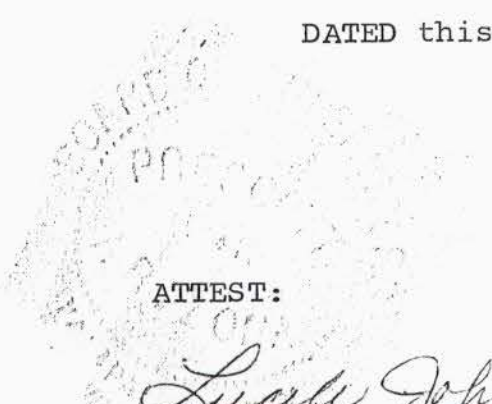
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the portion of said right-of-way, as above described, is hereby delineated as County highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the improvement be done according to plans heretofore submitted by said County Engineer and said County Engineer is authorized to acquire any property by lawful means as may be necessary for the construction of said County road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the public safety and convenience will be subserved by taking the right to make temporary entry upon the lands of the abutting owners to physically sever and remove obstructions lying on or within said right of way and the County Engineer is required to acquire such rights accordingly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Engineer secure an appraisal of the property to be acquired and the compensable damages to the owners' remaining lands be assessed and the necessary rights thereto be compensated, and upon failure to acquire said land by other lawful means the County Attorney of Yavapai County is authorized to initiate condemnation proceedings.
