

RESOLUTION NO. 433

MEDICAL RELIEF AND AID ELIGIBILITY MANUAL REVISION, TIME OF APPLICATION

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the following revisions to the Manual:

When eligibility commences: The term of eligibility for county medical care commences as of the date the applicant files a completed and signed application with the Director of the M.R.A. Office.

Exception-outpatient hospital treatment: The term of eligibility for county medical care will relate back to the date of the outpatient treatment at a hospital if the completed and signed application is filed with the Director of M.R.A. within one day after the date of the outpatient treatment.

Exception-inpatient hospital admissions: The term of eligibility for county medical care will relate back to the date of the inpatient admission to the hospital if a completed and signed application is filed with the Director of M.R.A. within three days after the date of admission. In the case of emergency hospital admissions, the term of eligibility will relate back to the date of admission if the hospital notifies the Director of M.R.A. of the location and condition of the patient pursuant to A.R.S. §11-297.01 and provided further that the patient files a completed and signed application prior to or within three days after the date of discharge from the hospital. M.R.A. personnel will be available to take applications at Yavapai Community Hospital in Prescott and at Marcus J. Lawrence Hospital in Cottonwood.


In calculating the time periods prescribed herein, the date of admission or discharge from the hospital shall not be included. If the last day for filing the application falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the period of time runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the present written M.R.A. policies be and are hereby repealed:


The rule that a spouse of a patient can make an application within two working days after discharge, said rule contained in a letter dated March 14, 1975 from the Director of M.R.A. to Yavapai Community Hospital.
