

Resolution No. 444

ENDORISING REAUTHORIZATION OF THE GENERAL REVENUE SHARING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States is considering legislation which will extend the General Revenue Sharing Program; and

WHEREAS, the program, which expired on September 30, 1980, must be reauthorized during the lame duck session beginning November 12; and


WHEREAS, S. 2574 and H.R. 7112 call for this reauthorization and the President has indicated support for the program's continuation; and

WHEREAS, the General Revenue Sharing Program has the lowest administrative costs of any of the federal assistance programs, is distributed on a fair and equitable basis, and provides recipient jurisdictions much needed flexibility in delivering locally determined services and programs; and


WHEREAS, Yavapai County, Arizona, without these funds would be forced to curtail seriously capital improvements and to decrease services in the field of law enforcement and the courts as well as other essential services;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors, Arizona, that we strongly urge the Congress to take up and pass, and the President to sign, legislation reauthorizing the General Revenue Sharing Program.
