

RESOLUTION NO. 548

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA

RESOLUTION REQUESTING MODIFICATION OF UNITED STATES
DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT,
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Camp Verde Sanitary District, through the Board of Supervisors, Yavapai County, Arizona, has applied for and received a grant from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development through the Governor's Office of Economic Planning and Development of the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, because of increases in the cost estimates to the District of its new interceptor sewer, treatment facility and effluent disposal facility which will be funded in part by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the Camp Verde Sanitary District bond election in May, 1982, did not authorize a sufficient amount of money to constitute the local share of the project; and

WHEREAS, the original intention of the Camp Verde Sanitary District in applying through Yavapai County to the Governor's Office of Economic Planning and Development for funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development was to be able to use a portion of that funding as part of the local share funding for the Camp Verde Sanitary District Environmental Protection Agency sewer project; and

WHEREAS, the Camp Verde Sanitary District has requested that the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County request a modification of the terms and conditions of the Community Development Block Grant which was applied for by Yavapai County for the Camp Verde Sanitary District; and

WHEREAS, the Camp Verde Sanitary District supplied a Statement of Justification for the Modification of the Grant, a copy of which is attached to this resolution.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County hereby makes application through the Governor's Office of Economic Planning and Development of the State of Arizona to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to modify the Grant which has heretofore been awarded to Yavapai County for the Camp Verde Sanitary District, said modification to allow the Camp Verde Sanitary District to borrow up to 50% of the available funds under said Grant to provide a portion of the local share of the Camp Verde Sanitary District's costs of the development of the sewage collection, treatment and effluent disposal facility financed in part by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.
