The above matter came before the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors at its meeting on May 22, 1989, at the request of Guy W. Bluff, P.S. agent for Highland Estates Improvement Association to abandon all of the streets in Highland Estates Unit One, more fully described as: Mundy Drive, Simmons Lane, Beaver Lane, and Red Rock Drive (name changed from Red Rock Road by Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 501), in their entirety, as dedicated and recorded in Book 16, page 36 of Maps and Plats in the office of the Yavapai County Recorder, Yavapai County, Arizona.

The County Engineer submitted a report and had no objection to the abandonment. The Board of Supervisors determined that the abandonment of the streets in Highland Estates Unit I will not leave any property without access to public roads and streets of Yavapai County, and is no longer necessary for public use, and the same should be granted.

And it further appeared that due and regular notice of the proposed abandonment was duly and regularly given by publication on May 12, 1989, and posted, and proof of such publication was made and filed with the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: (1) that the request for abandonment of all streets in Highland Estates Unit One, Yavapai County, Arizona, as described above, and as shown on the attached Exhibit A, be and the same is granted; (2) that the vacated streets shall vest in the Highland Estates Improvement Association, pursuant to A.R.S. §28-1902(4); (3) that the Highland Estates Improvement Association record an agreement granting mutual easements between property owners within the subdivision, leaving no property without access, said agreement is recorded in Book 2172, pages 187-262, of Official Records in the office of the Yavapai County Recorder; (4) that taxes be brought current on all parcels; (5) that rights of way or easements of existing sewer, gas, water or similar pipelines and appurtenances and for canals, laterals or ditches and appurtenances, and for electric, telephone, and similar lines and appurtenances shall continue as they existed prior to the disposal or abandonment thereof; and (6) that this resolution shall take effect when it is recorded along with an abandonment plat map in the office of the Yavapai County Recorder.
