CANYON VIEW CHANGED TO UNNAMED ROAD

WHEREAS, the Sedona Fire Department finds the roadway name of Canyon View to be confusing and conflicting with what the community knows the roadway to be called;

WHEREAS, the adjacent property owners / residents are not familiar and do not recognize Canyon View, and signage does not indicate the road to be called Canyon View;

WHEREAS, the Planning & Building Department has petitioned the Board of Supervisors to change Canyon View to Unnamed Road, essentially removing the roadway name from official county street name maps and records;

WHEREAS, Canyon View is a county right-of-way cul-de-sac running north from Mundy Drive, located in the Highland Estates Unit #2 subdivision, and recorded in Book 20 Page 95 of Maps and Plats;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was set for the Board of Supervisors to consider changing the roadway name Canyon View to Unnamed Road on February 22, 2000;

WHEREAS, a notice of this hearing was published in the Verde Independent and the Red Rock News on February 16, 2000, posted along the roadway, and mailed to all adjacent property owners, Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, Sedona Fire Department, Sedona Post Office, and the other related agencies;

WHEREAS, with the support of the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, Sedona Fire Department, and the County Engineering Department the Board of Supervisors will considered changing Canyon View to Unnamed Road;

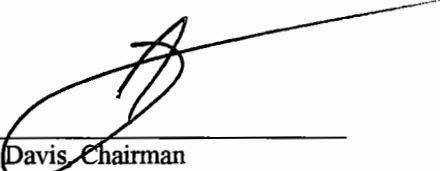
WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on February 22, 2000 to consider changing the referenced roadway name. No comment from the public was given, therefore the Board of Supervisors unanimously voted approval of the proposed change.
