RANCHO SANTA MARIA DRIVE & SAN ANTONIO ROAD, EASEMENT
EXTINGUISHMENT

The above matter came before the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors at its meeting on June 5, 2000, at the request of Mr. & Mrs. Robert Bureau to extinguish a temporary turn-around easement as recorded in Book 24 page 27 of Maps & Plats, in the office of the Yavapai County Recorder, Prescott, Arizona, pursuant to A.R.S. • 28-1907, and as further described on the attached Exhibit A.

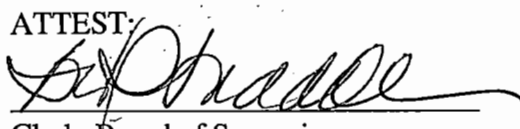
The County Engineer has recommended the extinguishment of said easement for turn-around on Rancho Santa Maria Drive and San Antonio Road. The Board of Supervisors determined that the extinguishment of said easement will not leave any property without access to public roads and streets of Yavapai County, and is no longer necessary for public use, and the same should be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: (1) that the request for extinguishment of the easement for turn-around, as described above, pursuant to A.R.S. • 28-1907, be approved; (2) that rights of way or easements of existing sewer, gas, water or similar pipelines and appurtenances and for canals, laterals or ditches and appurtenances, and for electric, telephone, similar lines and appurtenances shall continue as they existed prior to the disposal or extinguishment thereof; and (3) that this resolution shall take effect when it is recorded in the office of the Yavapai County Recorder.

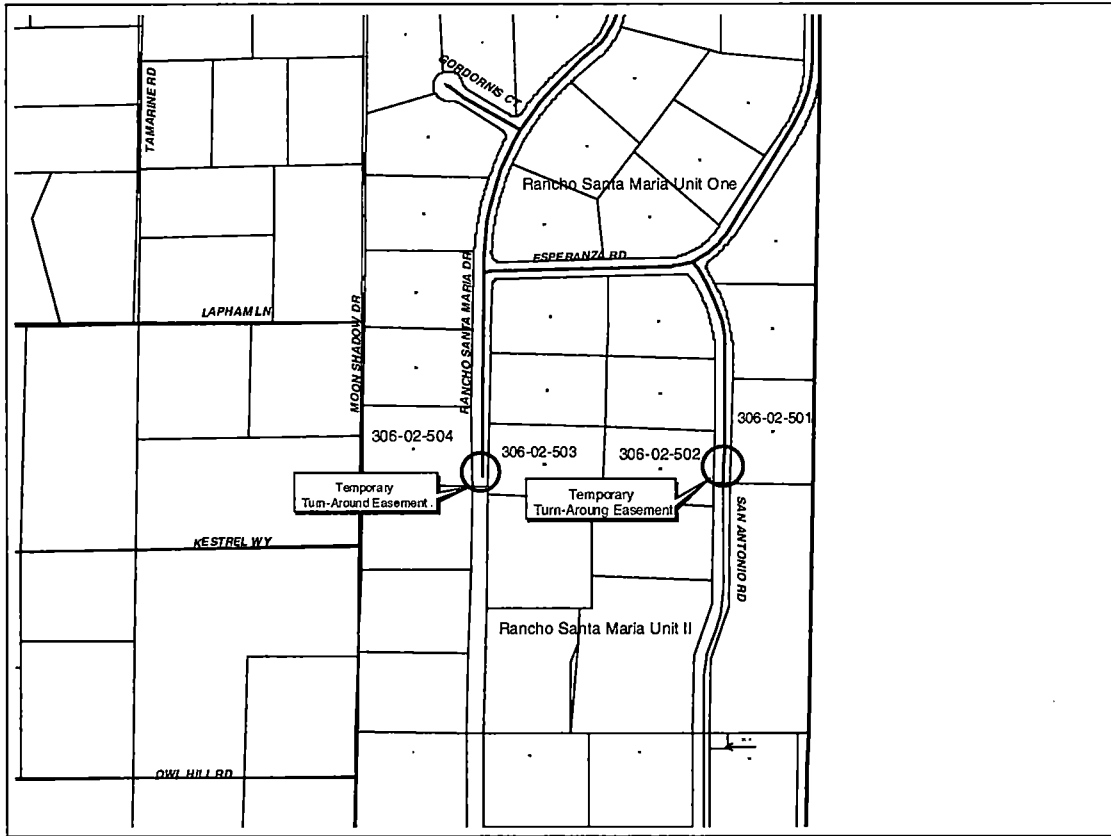
