RESOLUTION NO. 1269

GREENE ROAD & MICHAEL K DRIVE TO RAINMAKER

WHEREAS, Seventeen (17) of eighteen (18) adjacent property owners / residents to Greene Road and Michael K Drive, in the Williamson Valley area, petitioned the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors to rename Greene Road and Michael K Drive, in their entirety, to Rainmaker;

WHEREAS, The property owners / residents consider the two non-connecting parts of Greene Road and Michael K Drive to be one continuous roadway and one name for it would be more sensible and promote public safety;

WHEREAS, The first part of the roadway is known as Greene Road, it begins at its intersection with Williamson Valley Road, runs southwest for approximately 1,120 feet, more or less, to Michael K Drive. This part of Greene Road is located in the Equestrian Estates Unit #2 subdivision, recorded in Book 16 Page 13 of Maps and Plats;

WHEREAS, The second part of the roadway is known as Michael K Drive, continuing southwest for approximately 1,190 feet, more or less, to the second part of Greene Road. Michael K Drive is located in the Granite Mountain Homesites Unit #4 subdivision, recorded in Book 26 Page 9 of Maps and Plats;

WHEREAS, The third and last part of the roadway is known as Greene Road, continuing southwest for approximately 1,460 feet, more or less. This part of Greene Road is located in the Granite Mountain Homesites Unit #5 Phase 1 subdivision, recorded in Book 36 Page 28 of Maps and Plats;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was set for the Board of Supervisors to consider renaming the county right-of-way name known as Greene Road and Michael K Drive on November 6, 2000;

WHEREAS, a notice of this hearing was published in the Prescott Courier on October 25, 2000, posted along the street, and mailed to all adjacent property owners, Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, Central Yavapai Fire District, Prescott Post Office, and the other related agencies;

WHEREAS, with the support of the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, Central Yavapai Fire District, and the County Engineering Department the Board of Supervisors will consider renaming Greene Road and Michael K Drive, in their entirety, to Rainmaker;

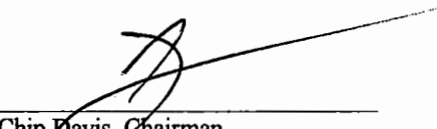
WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on November 6, 2000 to consider renaming the referenced street name. No comment from the public was given, therefore the Board of Supervisors unanimously voted approval of the proposed renaming.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Yavapai County declares Greene Road and Michael K Drive, as described above and illustrated on the attached exhibit A, be renamed to Rainmaker.

These name changes shall become effective 60 days after the date approved by the Board of Supervisors
