WHEREAS, property owners petitioned Yavapai County to officially name the street / easement adjacent to their property, in the Chino Valley area, Panamint Lane;

WHEREAS, the street petitioned to be named is in alignment with an existing named street known as Hidden Canyon Road;

WHEREAS, the street petitioned to be named and the north/south portion of Hidden Canyon Road are in alignment with a second unnamed street;

WHEREAS, in an effort to promote public safety and reduce confusion during emergency response, the Addressing / 911 Coordinator accepted the petition to name an unnamed street Panamint Lane;

WHEREAS, the Addressing / 911 Coordinator developed a plan to identify the one continuous physical street, as identified on the attached exhibit, as Panamint Lane;

WHEREAS, a pubic hearing was set for the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors to consider renaming a portion of Hidden Canyon Road, as part of the overall street name plan;

WHEREAS, a notice of hearing was printed in the Prescott Courier on February 20, 2002, posted along the referenced street, mailed out to the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, Chino Valley Fire Department, Public Works Department, and the adjacent property owners to the above referenced street;

WHEREAS, the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing received public comment on February 20, 2002;

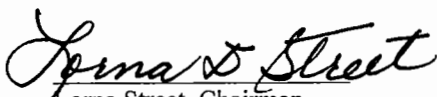

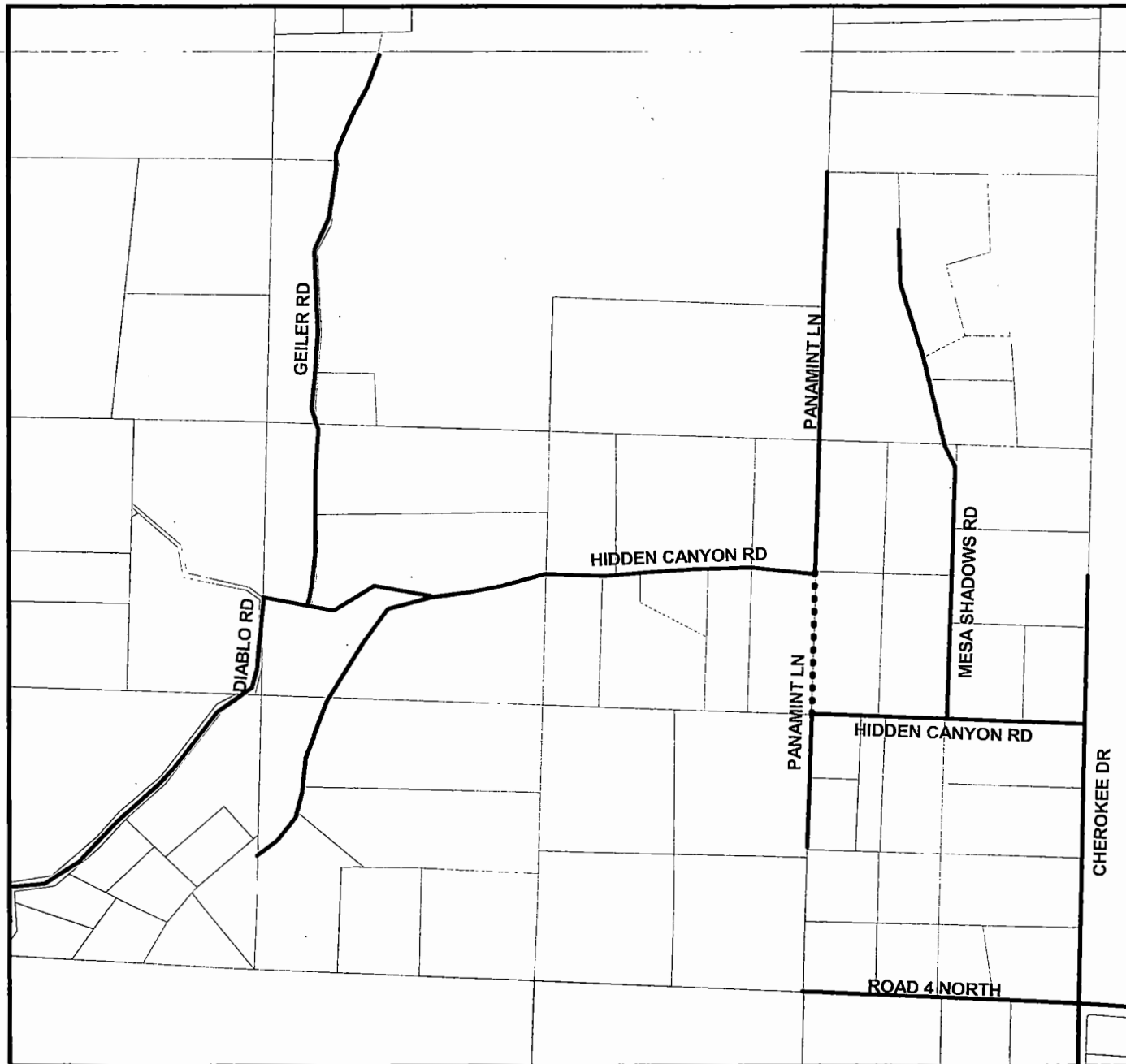
