April 21st Afternoon Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County Stands at 73 COVID-19 Cases, and 1 Additional Recovery

2,045 Yavapai County residents have been tested, with 1,973 negatives, 73 positives, 6 recoveries, and 1 death. VVMC reports 3 hospitalizations from COVID-19, and 12 persons under investigation (PUI). YRMC reports 3 hospitalizations with COVID-19, with 8 PUIs on West Campus, 5 on the East Campus. The VA has no COVID-19 hospitalizations or PUIs.

Forest Service Takes Steps to Reduce Human Caused Wildfire during Global Pandemic

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service, Southwestern Region is enacting a campfire ban to protect the health and safety of employees and communities during the COVID-19 pandemic. Beginning April 22, igniting, building, maintaining, attending or using a fire will be prohibited on all six national forests in Arizona until June 30, 2020, or until rescinded.
