April 23rd Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County has 76 COVID-19 Cases

58,697 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **5,769** positive cases – a 9% rate - and **249** deaths. Yavapai County has tested 2,149 residents – 72 more than yesterday - with 2,003 tests negative and 76 positives, with 2 new cases overnight. Cases are re-interviewed 2-4 weeks after initial interview to check on their recovery; so far, we have 6 recoveries, and 1 death in Yavapai County. VVMC reports 2 hospitalizations from COVID-19, and 9 persons under investigation (PUI). YRMC reports 3 hospitalizations with COVID-19, with 4 PUIs on West Campus, 6 on the East Campus. The VA has no COVID-19 hospitalizations or PUIs.

Governor Ducey Issues New Guidance on Elective Surgeries - With hospitals reporting increased availability of personal protective equipment (PPE) and bed capacity, Governor Ducey today issued an Executive Order removing restrictions on conducting elective surgeries for hospitals, health care facilities and providers that meet certain preparedness criteria. Facilities that meet the specified standards will need to receive approval from the Department of Health Services before resuming elective surgeries. Coping and Staying Strong for Your Children - Children need information just like adults do. So, talk with your child, acknowledge their fears, and allow them to express their emotions. It is important to note that these feelings and reactions are likely occurring for children with cognitive disabilities as well. Not every child or adult will react in the same way to the stress of COVID-19, but it is likely that everyone is reacting in some way. Monitor your child's emotional health during this time. Extended time at home and restrictions away from school may cause anxiety and concern. Maintain routines, connect with friends virtually, and take time for your family.
