April 3rd Afternoon Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services **We'll Get Through this Together**

Yavapai County stands at **41** cases, and more cases are expected. There are **27** residents in the Quad-Cities area, and **13** in the Verde Valley area, and **1** unknown; 13 seniors 65+, 25 adults 18-64; 3 minors. 19 males, 22 females. YRMC reports 2 COVID-19 hospitalizations today, with one person under investigation (PIU) on the East campus, and 8 PIUs on the West Campus. VVMC reports 1 hospitalization, and 5 PIUs
