## **April 5<sup>th</sup> Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services**

Yavapai County has 46 Cases of COVID-19

There have been **2,269** confirmed cases of COVID-19 and **64** deaths reported in Arizona.

Testing data has not been updated today, however the state cites a 93% negative rate. There are **46** cases in Yavapai County, **32** residents in the Quad-Cities area, and **14** in the Verde Valley area have been affected; 16 seniors 65+, 27 adults 18-64; 3 minors. 20 males, 26 females. YCCHS has more data than ADHS with cases reported after 5:00 p.m. yesterday. Early cases investigated were travel-related, but recent cases are mostly community spread.

### **Arizona receives Presidential Major Disaster Declaration, giving way for more COVID-19 aid**

Arizona is set to receive an estimated \$4.2 billion in aid from the national stimulus package adopted last Friday, and that is geared toward reviving the economy, the major disaster declaration specifically supports disaster-response efforts implemented by state and local governments.

The Governor's Office has said the declaration would help expand crisis counseling for front-line workers, supplement work being done by tribal health care professionals, provide grants to "reduce the risk of loss of life or property during future emergencies," make disaster-related legal assistance available to low-income residents and expand food assistance and other services to low-income households.
