April 8th Afternoon Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County now has 61 COVID-19 Cases

1,289 residents have been tested in Yavapai County, with 1,228 tests being negative (95%). VVMC reports 1 hospitalization from COVID-19, with 5 persons under investigation. YRMC reported 4 hospitalizations with COVID-19, with 10 persons under investigation on West Campus, 1 on the East Campus. A PUI is an in-patient who has been admitted for care that has been tested for COVID-19 with results still pending. YCCHS has received two additional cases overnight.

Dr. Fauci Predicts Decline of COVID-19 Cases but Warns Against Complacency

There's been talk of a possible plateau in disease over the next week or two in the U.S. The real challenge will be for the public and locales to not become overly confident and allow rampant community transmission to continue.

At the end of last week, the CDC recommended that individuals who do make necessary trips out of their home wear a nonmedical cloth mask to reduce asymptomatic spread of the virus. The length of time for the CDC to make the call was driven by the fact that healthcare workers who are putting their lives on the line every day, saying they don't have enough personal protective equipment, including masks. Although homemade masks are not perfect, Fauci said, "If you do not know you are infected, wearing a mask will go a long way to prevent you from infecting someone else."
