January 6th Update - Yavapai County reports 189 COVID-19 Cases and 3 Additional Deaths

20,938 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 since yesterday with **7,206** positive results and an additional **127** deaths. Since the beginning of the pandemic, Yavapai County has tested **84,660** residents with **12,752** positive cases, **4,749** recovered, and **240** deaths. YRMC West has **63** COVID-19 patients, YRMC East is caring for **32** patients. VVMC reports **29** COVID-19 hospitalizations. The VA reports **7** COVID-19 patients.

The Arizona National Guard is helping train volunteers who will be administering the coronavirus vaccine and supporting vaccination sites in Arizona. This is a coordinated effort between the Governor's office, Arizona



Department of Health Services and Arizona Department of Emergency and Military Affairs utilizing the volunteer base in Arizona Emergency System for the Advance Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals. According to a press release, those receiving training are retired medical professionals and current medical students. The move is to help speed up the vaccination schedule of millions of Arizonans and Americans. The trained volunteers will be sent to sites with the greatest need of additional hands.

If you are a healthcare provider with an active license, a public health professional, member of a medical disaster response team, or non-health community volunteer willing to be on-call to support Arizona in the event of a disaster - help support public health emergency preparedness and register at this link: <https://esar-vhp.health.azdhs.gov/>

During a declared emergency or disaster event, (e.g., public health emergency, wildfire, flood, or mass care incident), this system will be accessed by authorized medical/health officials at the State health Emergency Operations Center, or your local County. If a decision is made to request your service, you will be contacted using the information you enter on the site. If you agree to deploy, you will be provided additional information and instructions by appropriate field operational officials.

Registered volunteers are encouraged to join a local Medical Reserve Corps Unit to receive training and participate in public health and preparedness activities throughout the year. YCCHS is currently interviewing for the Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps Volunteer Coordinator position, to ramp up local trainings and activities.
