July 14th Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County reports 1,201 COVID-19 Cases, 6 additional Deaths

920,641 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with 128,097 positive results, and 2,337 deaths. Yavapai County has tested 23,411 residents with 1,201 positive cases, 491 recovered, and 21 deaths. Yavapai Regional Medical Center reports 22 COVID-19 patients on the West Campus and 1 person under investigation (PUI), as well as 3 COVID hospitalization on the East Campus with 5 (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports 13 COVID hospitalizations and 7 PUI. The VA is caring for 2 COVID-19 patients with 1 PUI.

The Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) reported 4,273 new coronavirus cases and 92 additional deaths this morning, but with a footnote about the data. ADHS said on Twitter one testing partner did not report results in time for Monday's report, meaning some of today's cases would normally have been reported a day earlier. It's not clear how many were carryovers from Monday. The department also said 23 of the deaths were confirmed through death certificate matching, meaning 69 fatalities from new reports, which may date back.

A confirmed death is a death that has had a positive diagnostic (PCR) test reported to public health. A probable death is one that hasn't had a positive diagnostic test, but the physician cited a COVID-related cause as their cause of death. COVID-19 mortality is higher in persons with underlying medical conditions and in those aged ≥85 years.

In Yavapai County, out of the 21 deaths reported, 13 individuals were over 75, and 8 were between 55 and 75 years of age; 17 men have died, and 4 women; with 11 from the Quad-Cities, 10 from the Verde Valley. Some of these deaths can be associated with the outbreaks at Granite Creek Rehabilitation and Cottonwood Village. YCCHS Director, Leslie Horton shared "My sympathies go out to the families who have experienced loss due to COVID-19. These deaths further demonstrate our duty to protect those most vulnerable in our communities."
