July 2nd Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County reports 853 COVID-19 Cases, 1 Additional Death

735,496 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **87,425** positive results, there have been **1,757** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **19,700** residents with **62** additional positive results overnight, bringing us to **853** positive cases, **361** recovered, and **11** deaths. Yavapai Regional Medical Center reports **30** COVID-19 patients on the West Campus and **no** persons under investigation (PUI), as well as **2** COVID hospitalizations on the East Campus with **6** people under investigation (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports **17** COVID hospitalizations and **0** PUI. The VA is caring for **3** COVID-19 patients with no PUI.

With the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation evolving quickly, we believe it's important to be transparent about how Yavapai County Community Health is responding to the outbreak. Our philosophy is to approach this situation with empathy and urgency. Our top priority is the health and safety of our employees and of the communities we serve. With the recent uptick in people receiving positive test results for COVID-19 and the incidence of the reported deaths, our department has increased our contact tracing team to reach out to these individuals to provide guidance to care for themselves, protect their family and friends, as well as to contact those who had contact with them.

YCCHS Director, Leslie Horton shared "My heart is with the family, friends and neighbors as they grieve the loss of your loved ones. This sadness is shared by our entire county as we work together to do what we can to keep each other safe during this difficult time."

Our team at Yavapai County Community Health Services has offered assistance to all assisted living and skilled nursing facilities across the county since the beginning of this pandemic in March. Due to recent increases in local COVID-19 hospitalizations, our team has spent the last two weeks reaching out to all Assisted Living sites across the county offering additional support, PPE, and assistance. We have also helped to arrange COVID-19 testing for sites who have had residents hospitalized with COVID-19 symptoms, or anyone with those symptoms on site.

It is challenging times like these that remind us that we are stronger when we work together and that we all have a role to play--whether it is ensuring that we are receiving and sharing valid, helpful information;

reaching out to isolated and at-risk people; showing compassion to ourselves and others or, simply being the calm centered example in a storm of anxiety.
