July 24th Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County reports 1,534 COVID-19 Cases

1,053,832 Arizonans have been tested (an increase of 15,908 tests) for COVID-19 with **156,301** positive results, and **3,349** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **26,343** residents with **1,534** positive cases, **609** recovered, and **54** deaths. Yavapai Regional Medical Center is caring for **20** COVID-19 patients on the West Campus and **5** on the East Campus with **3** persons under investigation (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports **6** COVID-19 hospitalizations and **8** PUI. The VA has **1** COVID-19 patients and **2** PUI today.

Executive Order regarding Opening Schools Highlights from Kathy Hoffman, Superintendent of Schools:

- By August 7, ADHS will create reopening benchmarks based on public health data.
- Full funding for distance learning
- Continuity of pay for all educators
- Face covering requirement
- Options for at-risk students while enforcing physical distancing and safety protocols.

These provisions will give schools more data, resources, and policies to support safe learning in the new school year, whether schools opt to provide in-person or distance learning. COVID-19 has challenged the education community and this Executive Order gives our school communities the ability to make a long-term plan that accounts for the unique public health realities of their communities and needs of their students.

Gov. Ducey announces extension to statewide bar, gym closure as COVID-19 pandemic continues

According to an executive order issued in connection with the closure extension, the extended closure order will continue to be reviewed for repeal or revision every two weeks.
