532,697 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **46,689** positive cases – an increase of **3,246** cases since yesterday, and **1,312** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **15,793** residents, with **422** positive cases, **220** recovered, and **7** deaths. Yavapai Regional Medical Center reports **8** COVID-19 patients and **no** persons under investigation (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports **6** COVID hospitalizations and **1** PUIs. The VA has reported **1** COVID-19 hospitalization and no PUI.

As record numbers of coronavirus cases continue to be reported in Arizona, state Health Director Dr. Cara Christ expects the totals to get worse before they get better despite policy changes. "But we do know the two best prevention methods for COVID-19 are to stay physically distanced and to wear a face mask," Christ said. "If we can get a majority of the population to do that hopefully we'll see a leveling off of cases."

Confirmed COVID-19 cases in Arizona rose by **3,246** since yesterday, the highest single-day increase since the start of the pandemic, according to data from the Arizona Department of Health Services. In Yavapai County, we have seen **54** COVID-19 cases since last Friday, and the highest hospitalization rate of the pandemic.

If there is one message YCCHS would like to give, it is this: we assure you this pandemic is real. We need your help protecting everyone from this pandemic. Your actions, or lack thereof, can put others at risk, including your loved ones, your friends, your neighbors, and your healthcare workers.
