## November 10th Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County reports 199 COVID-19 Cases and 5 Confirmed Deaths since Friday

16,105 Arizonans were tested for COVID-19 yesterday with 3,434 positive results and 28 deaths reported. Yavapai County has tested 53,545 residents with 3,399 positive cases, 1,578 recovered, and 97 deaths and 4 probable deaths. Since last Monday, we are seeing about 38 cases a day. YRMC West has 9 COVID-19 patients and YRMC West is caring for 4, with a total of 4 persons under investigation (PUI). The Verde Valley Medical Center reports 9 COVID-19 hospitalizations and 12 PUI. The VA reports 1 COVID-19 patients.

Influenza vaccination is being provided as a drive through service. Veterans do not need to have an appointment for receiving their flu vaccination and may remain in their car.
