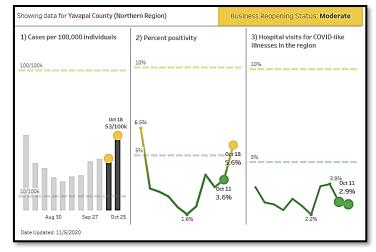
16,583 Arizonans were tested for COVID-19 yesterday with **1,996** positive results and **22** deaths reported. Yavapai County has tested **52,073** residents with **3,200** positive cases, **1,578** recovered, and **92** deaths. ADHS is updating MEDSIS, the state medical database, to make improvements. YRMC East/West is caring for **14** COVID-19 patients with **1** person under investigation (PUI). The Verde Valley Medical Center reports **8** COVID-19 hospitalizations and **3** PUI. The VA reports **1** COVID-19 patient.

Workplace and School dashboards for determining the level of community spread of COVID-19 in Yavapai County have been updated for the two-week period ending October 18. The county experienced an increase in cases per 100,000 from 37 per 100K to 53 per 100K; the positivity rate went from 3.6% to 5.6%, and hospitalizations have stayed below 3%.

In the past two weeks, Yavapai County has seen a significant increase in cases and higher hospitalization rates.

The state is reporting that most counties saw increases or continued elevated rates



of COVID-19 in their communities. While AZ is currently experiencing increases in the number of cases and percent positivity, the magnitude of the increase is not as great as the state experienced over the summer. Those over 65 have the highest rate of hospitalization and death, but individuals between the ages of 20-44 account for the highest number of cases. Statewide metrics still meet the benchmarks for the moderate category of COVID-19 spread for business and school opening, but we are seeing the rates and percent positivity increase in many counties across all regions of the state.
