Monday, November 15, 2021: Message from Don Herrington, Interim Director, ADHS If you are not vaccinated against COVID-19, get vaccinated. If you are fully vaccinated and are eligible for a booster, get a booster to make sure you have the fullest protection possible. COVID-19 vaccines are safe, free, and widely available around Arizona. Where there is substantial or high COVID-19 transmission (as we are seeing in Yavapai County) and as is currently the case in every county in Arizona, ADHS recommends everyone, whether or not they are vaccinated: 1) mask up in public indoor settings; 2) continue following other proven mitigation strategies, including physical distancing of at least 6 feet and frequent handwashing or use of hand sanitizer. 3) stay home if sick, 4) get tested for COVID-19 if they have symptoms or 3-5 days after exposure to someone who is positive.

Yavapai County reports 359 COVID-19 Cases and 13 Deaths since Friday, November 12, 2021. The county has tested 99,186 residents for COVID-19 in the past 6 months, and there have been 30,461 positive cases and 748 deaths since the beginning of the pandemic. Yavapai Regional Medical Center reports 73 COVID-patients, VVMC reports 20 patients, and the VA has 4 COVID-19 patients. The County is still experiencing high transmission of COVID-19 with a 17.9% positivity rate and 348 cases per 100,000 residents for the week ending October 31, 2021.
