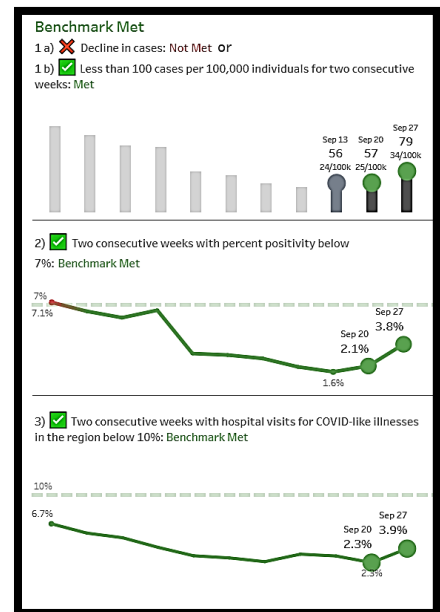
1,905,908 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **228,748** positive results and **5,789** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **46,833** residents with **2,747** positive cases, **1,459** recovered, and **86** deaths. YRMC West is caring for **4** COVID-19 patients with **2** persons under investigation (PUI), the East campus has **4** COVID-19 patients and **2** PUIs. Verde Valley Medical Center reports **4** COVID-19 hospitalizations and **2** PUI. The VA reports **no** COVID-19 patients.

ADHS Updated the School and Business Reopening Dashboards today - Yavapai County's status is still moderate, with cases per 100,000 at 34, a 3.8% positivity rate, and 3.9% of hospital visits having COVID-like illness. Community and business partners, working together with local health departments, have an important role in slowing the spread of diseases in Arizona. The actions you take make a difference.

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Wear masks in public settings.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- If you are at higher risk for severe illness, you should avoid attending congregate settings.

- **Today is the final day to complete the 2020 Census.** The Census determines the amount of federal funding our communities get for important priorities like schools, health care, and transportation. A complete count means more money for Arizona. The good news: according to the U.S. Census Bureau, more than 99.9% of housing units across the country have been accounted for in the 2020 Census.
