2,063,763 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **242,480** positive results and **5,918** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **49,728** residents with **2,969** positive cases, **1,578** recovered, and **91** deaths. YRMC West is caring for **10** COVID-19 patients with **3** persons under investigation (PUI), East campus has **0** COVID-19 patients and **4** PUIs. Verde Valley Medical Center reports **6** COVID-19 hospitalizations and **3** PUI. The VA reports **no** COVID-19 patients.

School and Workplace Dashboards Updated - Today's update for the two weeks prior ending October 11th, Yavapai County's percent positivity rate rose to 3.6%, the cases per 100,000 remained steady at 36/100k, and hospitalization visits for COVID-like illness was down to 3.0%. The county maintained its moderate status.

When will a coronavirus vaccine arrive, and when would you be most likely to get it? Coronaviruses are a large class of viruses and so far, there are no vaccines for any of them. At this point, the focus has been on treatments, such as the experimental antiviral drug



remdesivir, which has reportedly shown promising results, and dexamethasone, a steroid that doctors say increases survival rates among the most serious cases.

ADHS and the Vaccine Task Force are working to be prepared for a vaccine by the end of November or early December. The vaccine from Pfizer is promising. Although its four COVID-19 vaccine candidates are still in early-stage human trials, two of them have been fast-tracked by the FDA. Pfizer's goal is to distribute 100 million doses in 2020 and another 1.3 billion in 2021.
