## September 3<sup>rd</sup> Update - Yavapai County Community Health Services Yavapai County reports 6 new COVID-19 Cases, and 1 Confirmed Death

1,490,996 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with 203,953 positive results and 5,130 deaths. Yavapai County has tested 36,984 residents with a total of 2,331 positive cases, 1,016 recovered, and 78 deaths. YRMC West is caring for 4 COVID-19 patients, the East campus has 1 COVID-19 patient and there is 1 person under investigation (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports 2 COVID-19 hospitalizations and 5 PUIs. The VA has 1 COVID-19 patient, and no PUIs.

As September gets underway, COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths in Yavapai County have been declining, however with the careful re-opening of businesses, schools and the Labor Day weekend, we encourage our residents to stay safe, wear a mask when in public places, and maintain your distance from others.

"We use Labor Day to take the day off, but unfortunately the virus doesn't," said epidemiologist Jennifer Nuzzo, a senior scholar at John Hopkins Center for Health Security. "The more we travel, the more we interact with people, the more opportunities there are for exposure, it's really best that we try to limit our movement as much as possible."

What's happening in college campuses across the nation is very concerning. Classes have only just begun, and yet college campuses across the country are continuing to struggle with sudden coronavirus outbreaks on their campuses. 36 states have reported a total of 8,700 COVID-19 cases at colleges and universities. Campuses are asking students with travel plans to get tested before leaving campus for the holiday to reduce the risk of exposing their friends and family at home.
