1,505,837 Arizonans have been tested for COVID-19 with **204,681** positive results and **5,171** deaths. Yavapai County has tested **37,134** residents with a total of **2,338** positive cases, **1,018** recovered, and **79** deaths. YRMC West is caring for **6** COVID-19 patients, the East campus has **1** COVID-19 patient and there is **3** persons under investigation (PUI). Verde Valley Medical Center reports **2** COVID-19 hospitalizations and **3** PUIs. The VA has **1** COVID-19 patient, and **no** PUIs.

Gov. Doug Ducey announced Monday a series of steps aimed at getting more Arizonans vaccinated against the flu, explaining that the coming flu season will present "greater challenges" for a state already fighting the spread of COVID-19.

The state is working to increase the number of flu shots available to uninsured and underinsured Arizonans by increasing payments to providers who offer vaccines to members of the state's Health Care Cost Containment System, he said. The "Roll Up Your Sleeve" campaign will kick off next week with more of the details.

YCCHS is prepared for flu season, however pharmacies and grocery stores have received their shipments of vaccine much earlier, whereas our clinic has just received a small portion of the flu vaccine ordered. Sally McCoy, our Immunization Nurse Supervisor has been working with the Board of Supervisors in scheduling the outreach community flu clinics beginning in early October. As soon as the schedule is finalized, we will get the word out. All County offices will be closed on Monday, September 7th.
