YCCHS Update:

On September 16th and 17th, 2022, YCCHS partnered in the Yavapai County Stand Down event. This event is sponsored by <u>US Vets</u>, and provides a centralized location for relevant information and health services. This year there were representatives from Yavapai County Legal Services, Catholic Charities, <u>Assisteo</u>, <u>NAU</u>, <u>Prescott Area Shelter Services</u>, <u>OrCam</u>, <u>Polara Health</u>, NACOG, and others. This event was significantly more popular and fruitful than in previous years.

In total, 189 veterans were served during this two-day event. Among the many services provided, the YCCHS provided the following to veterans:

- 93 total vaccinations which include Hepatitis A, Flu, and the COVID-19 Booster.
- HIV/HVC screening.
