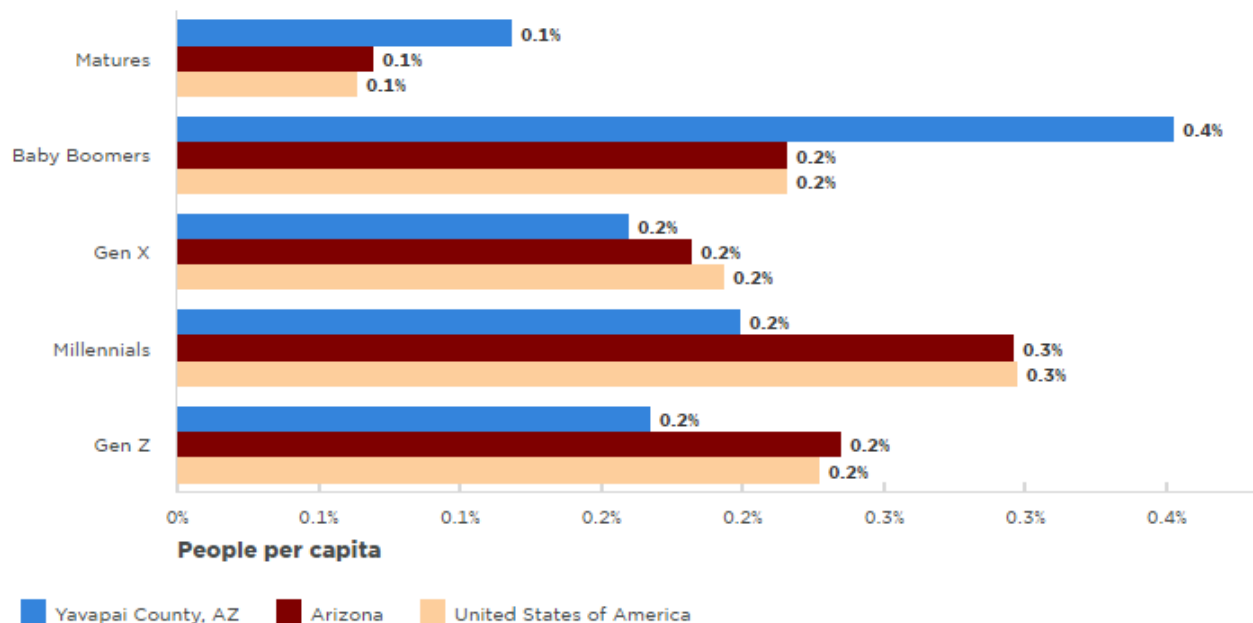

## YCCHS Rolls Out a Community Data Dashboard

In early 2019, Yavapai County Community Health Services YCCHS contracted with mySidewalk, a company out of Kansas City, MO, to create a data dashboard based on the 2017 Yavapai County Community Health Assessment and Improvement Priorities. The dashboard is designed to be interactive and accessible. The data is current and user friendly for community partners, elected officials, county employees and the public to utilize in reports, presentations and grant proposals. It is a living document with data updated on a regular basis.

mySidewalk's mission is to empower city leaders and the public with the most complete, clear, and real-time understanding of their communities so they can improve and innovate together. The mySidewalk solutions for health agencies include dashboards based on the best practices of the Public Health Accreditation Board and the Affordable Care Act requirements for non-profit hospitals and federally qualified health centers and were developed in partnership with thought leaders in Public Health and Health Care. The right data presented in the right way at the right time makes visible the powerful connection between health outcomes, access to health care, and local social, economic, and environmental policies. Their solutions are rooted in data-driven storytelling that is accessible, engaging and beautiful.
