How Will Yavapai MRC Respond to COVID 19?

When Yavapai County declared an Emergency response to the novel coronavirus pandemic, there were many unknowns as to how the virus would impact our towns, county and state. There were unknowns about the nature of this new virus and how quickly it would spread. There were unknowns about how it would impact our residents, schools, medical facilities and workplaces. Amid the continued unknowns, one thing is certain: Community needs are continuously changing, both hourly and daily.

CPR TRAINING IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

New Life CPR of Prescott is Still Offering CPR classes for the Community and Medical Staff

CPR certification is a requirement to join the **Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC)** and it is paid for by the MRC. Certification must be renewed every two years, as certification is only valid for 24 months.

If you are a current MRC member and need to update your certification, please select an option and send me update. If you are a new MRC member and do not have a current CPR certification, please take a look at the training calendar and notify me as to when you anticipate you will take a class.

During the coronavirus pandemic, New Life CPR is following American Heart Association recommendations:

- You will not be giving breaths—but "stimulating the breaths" still 30 compressions to 2 breaths.
- For an AHA BLS class, you will be using a valve/mask for your breathing skills.
- Classes are smaller in size.
- CPR and First Aid classes must bring lunch or snacks, as no one will leave the facility during class time and breaks are shorter.

ID BADGES UPDATE

<u>Current Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) volunteers:</u> You <u>MUST</u> wear your current badge for any volunteer work you conduct. It is imperative you keep track of your badge, it is the property of Yavapai County and must be accounted for.

<u>New MRC volunteers:</u> You will receive a badge as soon as we are able to print one. In the meantime, when you are deployed for your volunteer services, **Yavapai County Community Health Services**, **Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP)** will communicate with the facility for which you are volunteering and verify your MRC status.

When old and new ID Badges are ready for our current and new volunteers, we will be in touch to get them to you.

IMPORTANT: It is imperative you keep track of your badge as it is the property of the County and needs to be accounted for. If you resign from the MRC program, you will be <u>required</u> to turn in your badge and any MRC issued equipment.

The AZ HEALTH ALERT NETWORK (AZ HAN):

How Yavapai County Communicates with You in an Emergency

As a member of the Medical Reserve Corps, when there is a need for your services, you will be contacted either personally by a member of Yavapai County Community Health Services, Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) or through the AZ-HAN. The AZ-HAN is automated and "Call Out" to our volunteers will be three ways: 1. via telephone with an automated voicemail message; 2. via text, and 3. via email. You may receive all three or one, depending on personal contact information provided. The "Call Out" will communicate to you the current need and how you may respond.

The new AZ HAN Emergency Call Out phone number is (602) 555-1234. Please put this number in your cell phone contacts, entitled: Health Alert Network (HAN).

It is *very* important all of your contact information is up to date and that you respond to the call out. You <u>MUST</u> listen to the entire message and respond to the prompts as requested to register that you have received the message. <u>DO NOT</u> hang up until you have responded to the questions and your hear the final response, "Good-Bye." If you do not complete this process, your response will not be recognized and will show incomplete. The **AZ-HAN** is one of the main ways I will contact volunteers to assist with emergencies. The **AZ-HAN** Call Out system will call each number and email listed in our emergency contact until the message is answered with an <u>ACCURATE</u> response. *Thank you for your help with this!*

FEMA TRAINING

Medical Reserve Corps of Yavapai County requires all MRC volunteers to complete two

Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) courses in order to become an official national-standard MRC volunteer.

Those classes are IS-100.C - Introduction to the Incident Command System and IS-700.B - Introduction to the National Incident Management System.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, we have relaxed the completion standards of these important trainings. You will have a year from your officially completed onboarding to finish the two courses.

WHAT IS THE MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS?

The **Medical Reserve Corps** (MRC) is a national program created as a response to the events of 9/11 to provide a mechanism to register, credential and train medical and non-medical volunteers so they may be deployed in disasters and emergencies.

There are approximately 2,000 MRC units across the country, housed mostly in public health agencies. Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps was formed in 2003 to assist with public health threats or emergencies that overwhelm current resources.

Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps is comprised of medical technicians, pharmacists, physicians, nurses, mental health professionals, paramedics, and non-medical professionals.

For the coronavirus pandemic, medical professionals are needed to assist local medical facilities in a non-clinical or clinical setting. Also, nonmedical volunteers are needed for administrative duties.

Yavapai County Medical Reserve Corps is a service of Yavapai County Community Health Services.
