

# Standard Probation Supervision

Standard Probation Supervision focuses on the goals of behavioral change and accountability, which lead to the success of probationers and greater long-term community safety. These activities provide a foundation where intervention reduces risk and community involvement increases long-term success, with the overall result of greater long-term community safety.

Standard Probation caseload sizes are governed by State Law which dictates no more than 65 probationers to every one probation officer. Probationers are supervised according to their risk to reoffend, and referrals are made to internal and community programs for needed services such as substance abuse treatment, employment services, cognitive skills programs, and education needs. Attendance and progress in treatment are monitored closely to ensure that intervention reduces risk to re-offend.
