WHO QUALIFIES?

Academic Internship applicants must be students who are currently enrolled in good academic standing and will be completing their internship for academic credit at an accredited college/university. Upon joining the program, interns must be able to provide their own transportation to and from the internship site. As a general rule, interns are expected to be available at least 8 hours a week.

The Academic Internship Program is designed to place college/university students within the Adult Probation Department as student interns for the completion of specific projects, research, or studies ordered by the Board of Supervisors or developed by the Adult Probation Department.

These internships are unpaid, and projects are carefully designed to offer each intern a practical and meaningful internship experience. Participants normally spend 8-16 hours per week at their internship unless noted differently. An internship with the Adult Probation Department allows students to explore different programs offered within the Adult Probation Department and exposes students to real life experiences all while protecting the community and improving lives.

All internship candidates will be interviewed to determine area of interest and if found to be appropriate, have a background investigation completed as with any new employee, including a criminal history search and references checked, prior to acceptance.
