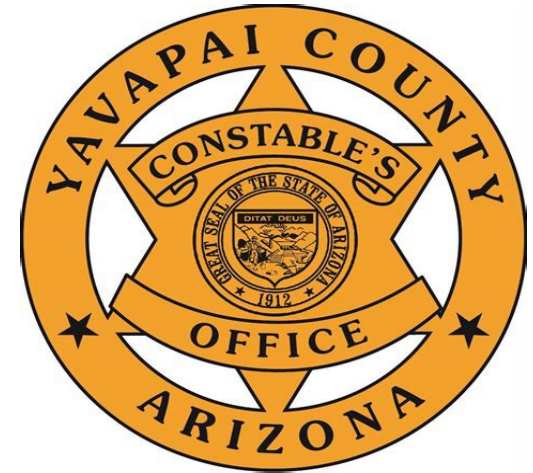

Fees

All fees are governed by Arizona Revised Statutes 11-445

Mileage is calculated at \$2.40 per mile from the Justice Court, one way. There is a minimum \$16.00 mileage fee per attempt at service.

A deposit of \$120.00 in the form of cash, cashier's check or money order for any process service, EXCEPT protective orders will initiate service. Make deposits payable to Seligman Constable.

Fees will be deducted from the deposit, and refund the balance back by check. Please do not mail cash.

When obtaining protective orders, writs, eviction actions and other processes issued from the Seligman Justice Court, the process and deposit may be left with the court clerk.

About Us

Constables are elected or appointed peace officers who attend the courts of justice of the peace within their precincts when required; and within their counties execute, serve and return all processes, warrants and notices directed or delivered to them by a justice of the peace of the county or by competent authority.

The provisions of the law relating to sheriffs, as far as applicable, govern the powers, duties and liabilities of the constables.

There are five elected Constables in Yavapai County, each serving in one Justice Precinct.
